Flag Day

June 14th, 2017

The Legion will be retiring flags soon, all are welcome to come out and join us for it.

The "Stars and Stripes", the official National symbol of the United States of America was authorized by congress on that Saturday of June 14, 1777 in the fifth item of the day's agenda. The entry in the journal of the Continental Congress 1774-1789 Vol. VIII 1777 reads "Resolved that the flag of the thirteen United States be Thirteen stripes alternate red and white: that the union be thirteen stars, white representing a new constellation." That flag has grown and evolved over the years to 50 stars (states) and 13 stripes (the original colonies).
