The Congressional Medal of Honor

On December 9, 1861 Iowa Senator James W. Grimes introduced S. No. 82 in the United States Senate, a bill designed to "promote the efficiency of the Navy" by authorizing the production and distribution of "medals of honor". On December 21st the bill was passed, authorizing 200 such medals be produced "which shall be bestowed



upon such petty officers, seamen, landsmen and marines as shall distinguish themselves by their gallantry in action and other seamanlike qualities during the present war (Civil War)." President Lincoln signed the bill and the (Navy) Medal of Honor was born. Two months later on February 17, 1862 Massachusetts Senator Henry







Wilson introduced a similar bill, this one to authorize "the President to distribute medals to privates in the Army of the United States who shall distinguish themselves in battle." Over the following months wording changed slightly as the bill made its way through Congress.

When President Abraham Lincoln signed S.J.R. No. 82 on July 12, 1862, the Army Medal of Honor was born. It read in part:

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the President of the United States be, and he is hereby, authorized to cause two thousand "medals of honor" to be prepared with suitable emblematic devices, and to direct that the same be presented, in the name of the Congress, to such non--commissioned officers and privates as shall most distinguish themselves by their gallantry in action, and other soldier-like qualities, during the present insurrection (Civil War).

With this simple and rather obscure act Congress created a unique award that would achieve prominence in American history like few others. The table below will acquaint you with a chronological time line of key events in the history of the Medal of Honor.

3 March 1847 Congress authorizes a "certificate of merit" be presented by the President when a "private soldier distinguishes himself in the service", along with additional pay of \$2 per month.

13 February 1861 Army Assistant Surgeon Bernard J.D. Irwin rescues the 60 soldiers of 2d Lt. George Bascom's unit at Apache Pass, Arizona. Though the Medal of Honor had not yet been proposed in Congress (and actually wouldn't even be presented to Irwin until 1894), it was the first heroic act for which the Medal of Honor would be awarded.

26 June 1861 Aboard the U.S.S. Pawnee, John Williams courage despite his wounds, his refusal to leave any man behind, and his love for the flag became the first act by a member of the U.S. Navy to merit the Medal of Honor.

The CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR SOCIETY is formed.

The Congressional Medal of Honor Society is incorporated.

5 August 1950 The United States Air Force was born on July 26, 1947 when President Truman signed the National Security Act of 1947.

On this date in 1950 Louis Sebille became the first flier of the now separate AIR FORCE to earn the Medal of Honor. In all, FOUR Air Force officers received Medals of Honor for action in Korea...all of them posthumous awards. (These four men, as had members of the earlier Air Service and Army Air Corps, were awarded Army Medals of Honor.)



December Historical & Current Events

December 1st

The United States Government held its first draft lottery since WWII, 1969

December 3rd

The first American flag was raised aboard the "USS Alfred," 1775

December 4th

General Washington bade farewell to his troops, 1783

December 5th

The Medal of Honor was presented to Captain Roger H.C. Donlon, U.S. Army, for heroism in South Vietnam, the first person to receive the medal since the Korean War, 1964

December 6th

Gerald Ford sworn in as vice president, following the resignation of Spiro Agnew, 1973

December 7th

Japanese warplanes attacked United States at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, 1941

December 8th

A huge submarine net made of steel, that was placed underwater across the Narrows in New York harbor at the beginning of the war, was removed, 1919 A treaty was enacted which prohibited nuclear weapons in space, 1966

December 9th

A bill was introduced to create the Congressional Medal of Honor (Navy), 1861 The first Red Cross Christmas seals were sold for a campaign against tuberculosis, raising \$135,000, 1907

December 15th

The Bill of Rights went into effect, 1791

The plane carrying Bandleader Glenn Miller was lost, 1944

December 17th

France recognized American independence, 1777

The first one-way street was created in New York City, 1791

Orville and Wilbur Wright's first successful manned powered flight occurred near Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, 1903

December 19th

The first issue of "The Crisis," by Thomas Paine, which was a series of pamphlets writt to bolster the morale of the Continental Army, was issued, 1776

December 21st

Mayflower Pilgrims landed at Plymouth, Massachusetts, 1620

The (Navy) Congressional Medal of Honor medal was approved and authorized by Congress, 1861

December 22nd

The crew of the "USS Pueblo" was released, 1968

December 23rd

Washington resigned as commander-in-chief, at Old Senate Chamber, State House, Annapolis, Md, 1783 "A Visit From St. Nicholas" (The Night Before Christmas) by Clement C. Moore, was published in New York, 1823

December 24th

Henry Ford completed his first successful gasoline engine, 1894

December 25th

The first recorded Christmas was celebrated in Rome, A.D. 336

"Silent Night" was performed for the first time at the Church of St. Nikolaus, Oberndorff, Austria, 1818 George Washington crossed the Delaware River, 1776

December 27th

"Howdy Doody" with host Bob Smith, made its TV debut on NBC, 1947

December 30th

The "USS Monitor" was lost off Cape Hatteras, 1862
