A Sidelight on World War TWO ~ An act of Patriotism

Mary Babnick Brown was an American woman who donated her long blond hair to be used as crosshairs in Norden bombsights in WW II

Brown was a Coloradan; the children of Slovenian immigrants. She left elementary school at the age of 12, to help support her family as a servant for \$5/week. When she was 13, she lied about her age so that she could work at National Broom Factory for 75 cents a day, a job she held for 42 years. Her younger siblings pitched in by picking up chunks of coal that had fallen onto the railroad tracks. Brown's lone prized possession was her knee-length fine blonde hair.

In 1943, Brown saw an advertisement in a newspaper, searching for women with blonde hair of at least 22" length, that had never been treated with chemicals or hot irons. The military was offering to purchase such hair, to be used for meteorological instruments in the war The "meteorological instruments" were actually crosshairs for Norden bombsights. The Army Air Forces (the predecessor to today's US Air Force) had tried various materials for the Norden bombsight, including black widow spider webbing, but nothing could withstand the temperature variations like fine blonde human hair that had never been treated with



Brown in the 1940s

Brown sent off a sample of her 34" blonde hair to the government for analysis. After analyzing her hair, they agreed to purchase it, offering to pay her in war savings stamps. But Brown wouldn't accept payment for her hair. She saw it as her patriotic duty to help the war effort. She later recalled that she cried for months after cutting her hair.

chemicals or heat.

It was decades before Brown learned the true use of her hair, and the effect of her sacrifice. In 1987, on her 80th birthday, she received a personal thank-you letter from President Ronald Reagan:



Dear Mrs. Brown:

I was pleased to learn of your strong love for our nation, of how you donated your hair to the war effort during World War II and of its use as crosshairs in the Norden bombsight, helping our bombadiers sight enemy ground targets in Europe and the Padific. You can be very proud of a selfless act that set a splendid example during wartime. Your story has touched me deeply.

When I hear of such patriotism, I am reminded of what an honor it is to be called to serve as Fresident of the United States.

Nancy joins me in sending our warm best wishes for a very Happy 80th Birthday.














All four (4) wheels must be used.

ERIE SHORES COUNCIL - SWAN CREEK DISTRICT PINEWOOD DERBY RULES & GUIDELINES

- 1. Each Cub Scout is to build a *complete new car* each year. No car or portion thereof, used in any previous year by a Cub Scout, shall be entered.
- P. WEIGHT: Weight shall not exceed **5.00 oz.** No loose materials of any kind are permitted on the car. The car may be hollowed out and built up to maximum weight by the addition of wood or solid metal only, provided that it is **securely built into the body or chassis**. Liquids are considered loose material. Weights secured by tape will not be accepted.
- B. **SPRINGING**: The car shall not ride on any type of springs.
- 4. **ATTACHMENTS**: The car must be free-wheeling with no starting device.
- 5. **LUBRICATION**: Lubrication is allowed only before inspection. No lubricant shall be permitted on exposed surfaces of wheels. No oil may be used, only powdered graphite or powdered Teflon.
- 6. **INSPECTION**: Each car must pass the Inspection Committee before it may compete. The Inspectors have the right to disqualify those cars which do not meet these specifications. The decision of the Committee Chairs or designee will be final.
- Shepherds will guide drivers to the starting lines where the drivers will place their cars on the track. All persons not directly involved in the race must remain behind the barriers.
- 8. **BEST DESIGN**: At the District competition a car may enter either Best Design or Speed Race, not both.
- If any car jumps the track more than two times in any one heat, it will automatically be disqualified for that heat.
- 10. Each pack may enter a total of twenty (24) cars, four (4) cars in each grade category: K, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th grade. No more than two (2) cars may be entered in the race competition and two (2) cars may be entered in the design competition of each grade category. The winning cars may not be altered or rebuilt between the Pack and District races. Damaged cars may be put in original condition.
- 11. It is suggested that each Pack select a runner-up in each grade category to serve as an Alternate to the competition. Alternates should be chosen in case the winner or runner-up cannot participate on race day; however, there will be no alternate race due to time restrictions. Alternates should only attend if winners are unable to make race day.
- 12. To enter any race, the scout must be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America at the time of their Pack derby.
- 13. On the day of the race, each Cub Scout will sign in, race their own car, and must be present to receive an award.
- 14. Decisions of any and all judges will be final.

NOTE: Please observe the spirit of the competition, which is for the Cub Scout *themself* to enjoy building, decorating, and racing their car, using the basic material provided in the kits with adult assistance only as necessary.


